The award ceremony will take place as a whole school at 2.30pm for pupils and staff after all competitions.



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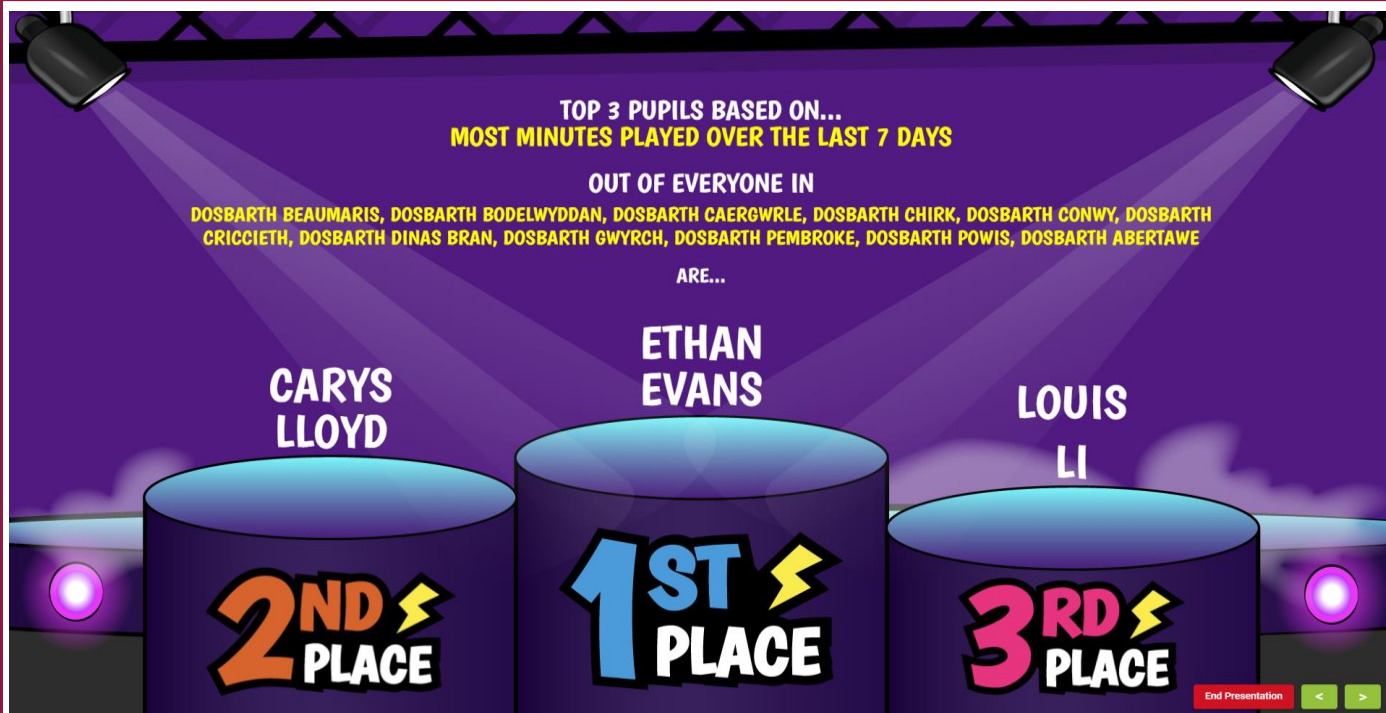
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Derbyn -

In Reception, pupils have been using different classroom resources to help develop and embed their understanding of measuring!

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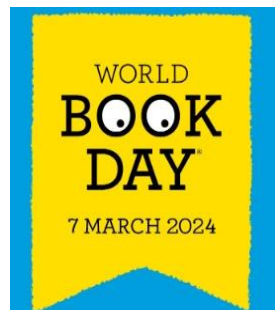
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The children have enjoyed taking part in a variety of activities to celebrate World Book Day today. It has been lovely to see the children pairing up with other classes to share a reading experience with each other.
