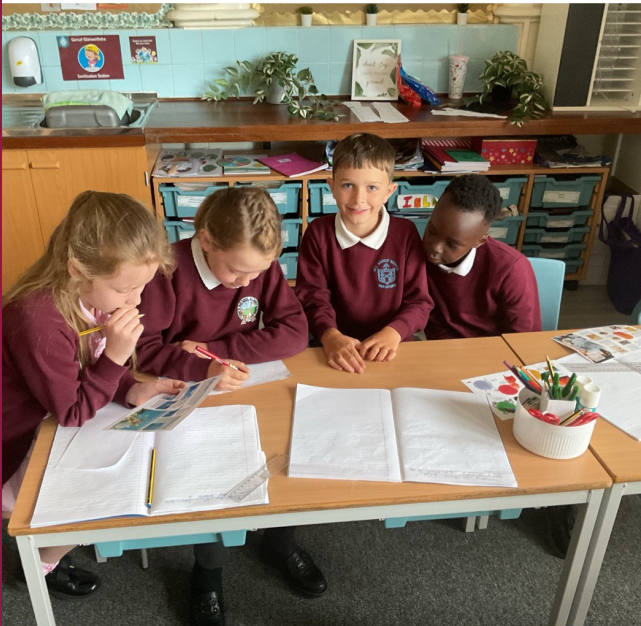

Blwyddyn 3e4 - Literacy

Pupils have been busy exploring their new writing genre focusing on chronological report. They worked in small groups to explore a range of reports and then identified key features, discussing what makes them effective.

Blwyddyn 3&4 - Food Chains

Pupils have been learning about food chains. They have explored a range of resources independently and used their findings to create their own rainforest food chains. They demonstrated great independence when selecting information and organising it correctly. As part of this learning, they have developed their understanding of new vocabulary, including producer, consumer, predator and prey.



Blwyddyn 3&4 - Mathematics & Numeracy

Pupils have been embedding their knowledge of finding fractions of shapes by playing a spinner game. There were some close games with the pupils playing rapidly and strategically.

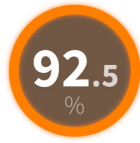
What's our attendance picture?

For All Pupils



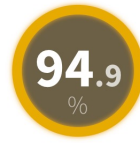
Attendance Month to Date
