Our Breakfast and Teatime Club building is accessible, only to those who have booked and are attending a session, due to Care Inspectorate Wales regulations around numbers of children on that part of the school site. Thank you for your cooperation.

Could we ask for your support in ensuring that all items of clothing are labelled and that children are reminded to store clothing correctly in their boxes at school. At this time of year, we often find lots of stray gloves and hats around which can be hard to reunite with owners!

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
