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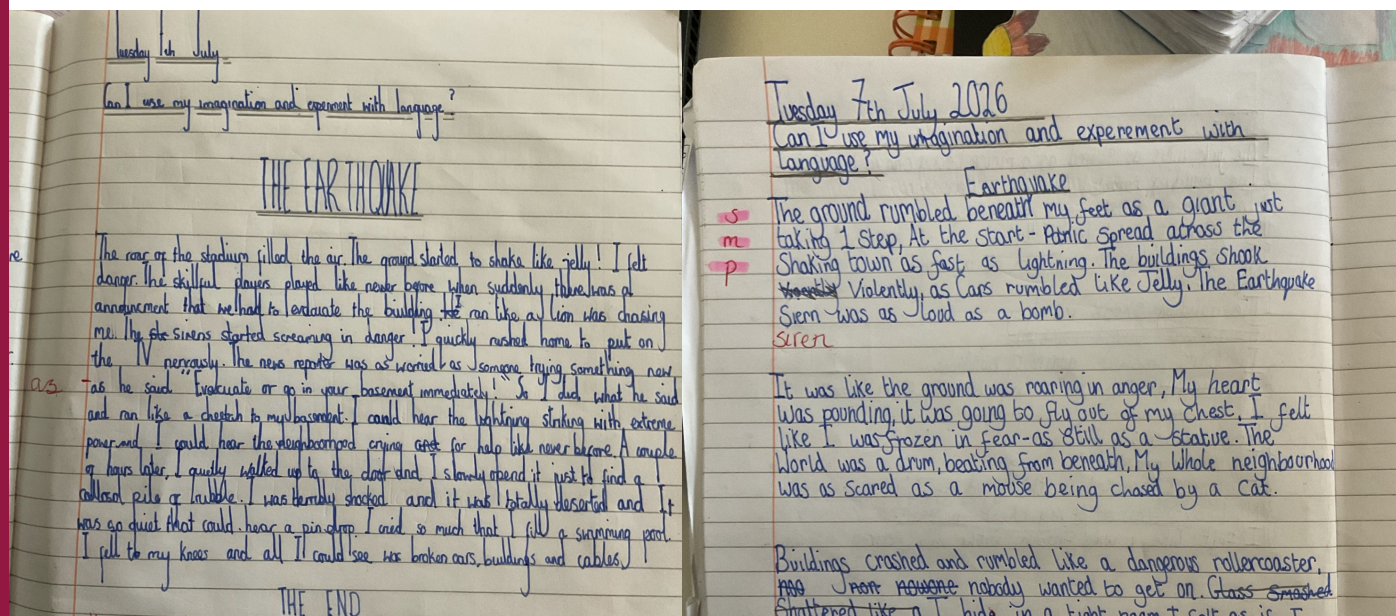
Blwyddyn 5&6 - One Word Reviews

Pupils have been busy in Language, Literacy & Communication and have started their first drafts of a descriptive piece of writing. We are excited to see how these pieces of work develop next week!



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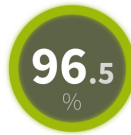
What's our attendance picture?

We keep a close focus on attendance and ensuring pupils attend school as often and as punctually as possible. You can see trends and patterns over the year below.



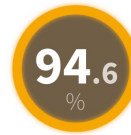
**Attendance

For All Pupils



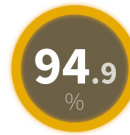
**Attendance
