We all enjoyed taking part and singing along with other schools in Wrexham in the 'Make some Noise' event!





The Marathon of Hope was Terry Fox's inspiring cross-Canada run in 1980 to raise awareness and money for cancer research. After losing his right leg to cancer, Terry set out to run a marathon a day, every day, starting in St. John's, Newfoundland. He covered more than 5,000 km in 143 days before his cancer returned and forced him to stop near Thunder Bay, Ontario. Though he could not complete the journey, Terry's courage and determination sparked a lasting movement and today, millions of people around the world continue his legacy through the annual Terry Fox Run, raising billions for cancer research.

This year we are promoting the fun run to be held in Wrexham in aid of the Institute of Cancer Research here in the UK. It is a 5km run but you can walk as there is no pressure to compete. The main aim is to raise awareness of this particular charity. Last year we had the pleasure of hosting Terry's brother, Fred, to share the story of Terry and all that he accomplished in a short space of time: a very moving experience.
