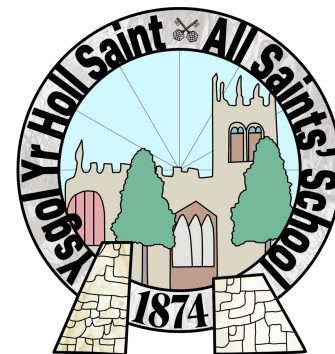

Ein Byd, Ein Dewis / Our World, Our Choice

This exciting, enquiry-based unit of work will develop learners understanding of Climate Change, how it will affect them and how they can take action.

Language, Literacy & Communication

Pupils will be building upon their skills when writing to persuade and inform. They will also develop their poetry skills by working with Mr Phormula (a Welsh rap artist) to produce a climate change rap drawing upon their oracy skills. Finally, the children will be producing and sharing a video to showcase their learning and make recommendations as to how we can combat climate change, which will be shared in showcase event.

Mathematics & Numeracy

Pupils will learn about fractions: finding equivalent fractions, ordering fractions and converting between mixed numbers and improper fractions. They will learn how to calculate percentages of amounts. Pupils will use efficient methods for finding the perimeter and area of two-dimensional shapes. Pupils **will be expected** to fluently recall multiplication facts up to at least 10 x 10 and use these to derive related facts

Science & Technology

Pupils will investigate the effect of greenhouse gases on temperature and relate this to climate change. They will also carry out an investigation to test the effect of CO₂ on water, to replicate the impact upon our oceans. Pupils will use their findings throughout this topic when writing to persuade and inform. Principles of fair testing will be developed throughout this work.

Humanities

Through enquiry-based learning pupils will develop skills and understanding of the consequences of actions of others, and how they affect our locality, Wales, as well as the wider world. They will learn how people influence change positively and embrace their responsibility as stewards of our world, becoming ethically informed citizens who are willing to make a difference.

Expressive Arts

Pupils will use the school's creative process to develop movie making skills, such as camera angles and positioning, lighting and audio effects, and editing skills to produce a music video. Our focus artist is Courtney Mattison, we will be looking at her work using it as an inspiration to create our own clay sculptures based upon coral.

Health & Wellbeing

Pupils will explore differences within relationships and develop conflict resolution skills. In our PE lessons pupils will continue to develop their sequencing through gymnastics and building upon teamwork skills in team games such as football, netball and basketball. In Forest School pupils will focus upon changing seasons and outdoor cooking alongside fire safety.

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
