During school holidays, Holiday Club can be contacted by calling the school number (01978 852342) and following the relevant options. Parents and carers can also speak to staff when dropping off or collecting their children. Class DoJo and email addresses are not monitored over the school holidays and it is not possible to accommodate any late bookings or amendments to bookings once the booking window has closed.

#### School Meals

After the Easter Holidays, pupils in Year 1 and 2 will be eligible for a Free School Meal every school day in addition to all pupils in Reception.

Should you wish to take advantage of this, please ensure that you book your child's meal on Parent Pay in advance of them returning to school. Parent Pay bookings cut off at 8am on the day that the child has their meal. Booking on Parent Pay is essential.

The Local Authority have advised that parents and carers in Year 1 and 2 should wait until **Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> or Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2023** to book their child's meals once the system has updated to reflect the changes and eligibility for all pupils.

Should any issues arise and payment be taken, refunds will be made in full from the Local Authority.

It was wonderful to celebrate a belated World Book Day in school this week. Pupils spent the day immersed in literacy based activities to promote reading for pleasure. Thank you for supporting the children with their fancy dress and reading regularly at home; regular reading at home is essential to support progress in reading.





#### School Uniform - September 2023

Following consultation with our pupils, parents and carers, the Governing Body have determined that only minor changes will be made to the school uniform for the 2023/24 school year.

We have listened to feedback regarding supply, quality and availability of the current school uniform and following this wish to advise that the school uniform supplier will change from Forester Sports, Mold, to **RAM** Leisure, Wrexham from when we return after the Easter Holidays.

We are removing the split between the Winter and Summer uniform to support families with the rising costs they are experiencing. Pupils are able to wear their uniform flexibly (From the list of uniform items below) as we are aware patterns of weather are becoming ever more difficult to predict! To this end, the school uniform will be made up of the following from September 2023:

Grey trousers/shorts/skirt or light pink gingham dresses, Light blue shirts/blouses/polo shirts, school tie (when wearing shirts/blouses) Burgundy jumpers/cardigans.

School jumpers available from RAM Leisure will have the school logo, however, plain jumpers are also acceptable as part of the school uniform. School shoes (which can be polished) must be worn and trainers are only permitted for P.E. Days. The P.E. kit will remain unchanged in a plain white t-shirt (plain black hoody/school jumper when cold) and black shorts or tracksuit bottoms. The school tracksuit will continue to be available from RAM Leisure as will items such as Reading Bags.
