

We have a clear policy in relation to Managing Medication and Healthcare Needs and this does include completion of a consent form when medicine comes to school and also logging the administration of medication by school staff. Could we request that where ever possible, medication is administered at home as we have had a significant increase in medication coming into school recently.

#### Science in Year 6

As part of their studies into World War Two, pupils in Year 6 have been exploring the impact of air resistance on falling objects.
