<u>leithoedd, Llythrennedd a Chyfathrebu /</u> <u>Languages, Literacy and Communication</u>

Children will focus on developing their persuasive writing skills by creating leaflets about the local area. They will plan, draft and edit their writing with a focus on powerful and emotive vocabulary. There will be opportunity to develop reading and comprehension skills through research of places of interest in the community. Whilst learning about the Gresford Mining Disaster, children will be taught script writing skills in preparation for delivering a videoed news report which will develop and refine presentation skills and use of formal language.

<u>lechyd a Lles /</u> Health and Well-being

Weekly Forest School sessions will see children learn and refine basic forestry skills and have opportunity to explore and develop their enquiry and problem solving abilities. The outdoor learning environment will be used to support artistic & craft work where the children will create 'Mining Art' and Christmas decorations.

Lessons from the KiVa programme will be delivered to aid social skills & develop understanding. Children will also learn about the importance of healthy bodies & minds through various community projects. In lessons with George, children will cover hockey & gymnastics.

Cymraeg / Welsh

Children will work on personal profiles and introducing themselves and others. They will learn landmarks vocabulary and be taught to describe journeys. Helpwr Heddiw sessions will allow for practicing oracy skills.

Mathemateg a Rhifedd /

Mathematics and Numeracy

This term the children will focus on number and the number system and place value before moving on to learning about addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. They will use a range of methods to solve different types of problems. They will also learn about length, perimeter and area and will use statistics to analyse mining related data.

Addysg Grefyddoll / Religious Education

The children's RE work will focus on identity and belonging this term. They will learn about religious symbols and artefacts and how community is demonstrated in all faiths and none. They will look closely at the role church plays in a Christian community.

<u>Dyniaethau /</u> Humanities

Over the term, children will learn about key landmarks in our community and the history of the area. They will use geographical enquiry skills to find out about the local dairy and the areas it supplies. Map making and reading skills will be taught and put into practice in the locality with numerous field trips. Focus will be made on the Gresford Mining disaster and the impact it had on the community.

Gwyddoniaeth a Thechnoleg /

Science and Technology

During this term, the children will learn through practical activities and research that light is needed to see and that light is the absence of dark. They will learn how light is reflected from surfaces and that shadows are formed when light source is blocked. They will learn about light safety and how to protect themselves.

In our work on sound, children will ask questions to investigate how sound is made and how it travels. They will also investigate what makes sound change pitch and volume through setting up simple practical enquiries and fair tests. In all science work children will gather, record, classify and present data in a variety of ways to help them answer questions.

Y Celfyddydau Mynegiannol / Expressive Arts

Using the Gresford Mining Disaster Memorial as inspiration, children will use a range of media to create their own interpretation of the wheel. They will study the work of Martyn Evans and imitate his style to create 3D models of landmarks in our community. Using charcoal made in forest school, children will develop their line drawings and shading techniques to draw mining artefacts. They will also learn traditional mining songs and work in groups to perform these to an audience.

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
