leithoedd, Llythrennedd a Chyfathrebu / Languages, Literacy and Communication

Using the text 'Escape from Pompeii' the children will have opportunity to read and listen to the story and engage in the text through discussion and drama. They will focus on powerful vocabulary and thesaurus skills. They will plan, draft and edit their own stories using the text as inspiration. Using their stories, the children will write playscripts and will act out their drama performances to a small audience.

Using a real life natural disaster as a stimulus, the children will plan, draft and write a newspaper article. The poetry focus will be on Kennings where the children will write poems based on an Extreme Earth event which will be presented digitally.

lechyd a Lles / **Health and Well-being**

Children will explore how decision making can impact on the quality of lives, they will also learn to identify and assess risks to keep themselves safe. Through learning about natural disaters, children will be taught that how we process and respond to our experiences affects our mental health and emotional well-being. They will have the opportunity to explore the benefits of physical activity through orienteering.

Cymraeg / Welsh


The children will revise and extend their use of positional language to describe the location of objects and to read maps. They will also create personal profiles and profiles of people and places. Revision of language patterns will take place through Helpwr Heddiw sessions.

Mathemateg a Rhifedd / **Mathematics and Numeracy**

This term the children will learn about fractions of shapes and fractions of numbers. They will apply their number skills to learning about money. Time will also be covered in this term. Children will also practice their reasoning skills and have the opportunity to revise and recap previous areas of maths from the year.

Addysg Grefyddoll / **Religious Education**

The children's RE work will focus on The Natural World and Living Things. They will learn about creation stories from different religions such as Judaism, Sikhism, Hinduism and Islam. They will also learn about the scientific creation explanation and non-religious views. They will explore the idea of stewardship and the importance of caring for our world.



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Dyniaethau / **Humanities**

The children will be learning about the hottest, coldest, wettest and driest places on Earth. They will be learning about extremes of weather and the impact to human life. They will also be learning about tsunamis, volcanoes, earthquakes and floods. Children will have the opportunities to guide their own learning throughout this topic.

Gwyddoniaeth a Thechnoleg / **Science and Technology**

During this term, the children will investigate and classify rocks and ask relevant questions and use different types of scientific enquiry to answer them. They will recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter and will begin to recognise similarities and differences in different soils. They will have the opportunity to investigate and describe in simple terms how fossils are formed. Practical investigations will be carried out throughout the term to enhance the learning experience.

The children will learn about forces and magnets and will investigate how different surfaces require different levels of force to move objects over. They will practice interpreting results and drawing conclusions and will form their own theories to explain scientific facts. Using the ICT suite, the children will have the opportunity to create, sort and filter databases. They will also look at branching databases to aid their computational thinking.

Y Celfyddydau Mynegiannol / **Expressive Arts**

The children will use clay to create labelled models of volcanoes and then evaluate their work.

They will create a storm composition using percussion instruments and then compose a piece of music to portray a natural disaster.

With a focus of hurricanes, children will create their own piece of art using mosaic tiles.

They will also practice their sketching skills to illustrate drought and flood impacted land.

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
