

**leithoedd, Llythrennedd a Chyfathrebu /  
Languages, Literacy and Communication**

Using the Queen's Token by Pamela Oldfield, children will make predictions and find clues in the text that show the period of history the story is set in. They will build character profiles and use adjectives to describe emotions and character traits. The children will learn how to plan a story, starting with setting the scene, followed by planning problems and resolutions into the plotline and ending with a conclusion that takes the reader back to elements of the beginning of the story. Within their story writing, children will have opportunity to develop their skills of using punctuation and written dialogue as well as using language to convey the passage of time.

**Iechyd a Lles /  
Health and Well-being**

The children will continue to develop their understanding and practice of positive mental health and well-being through My Happy Mind lessons as well as working on their social skills through the KiVa programme. We will focus on healthy eating and the impact of a good diet through our work on the Tudors. PE lessons will see children being introduced to lacrosse, honing their skills and building up to small sided games. In lessons with George, children will work on athletic events in readiness for sports day.

**Cymraeg /  
Welsh**

Children will work on describing character traits of another person and talking about activities, events and people in the past tense. They will learn topic specific vocabulary such as food, clothing and hobbies. Helpwr Heddiw sessions will allow for practicing oracy skills.

**Gwyddoniaeth a Thechnoleg /  
Science and Technology**

During this term, the children will learn about the classification of plants and animals through flow diagrams, common characteristics and scientific research. They will carry out on site investigations during a visit to Maes-y-Pant and will draw their own conclusions based on their findings. The children will plan their own scientific enquiry to explore food chains and they will make careful observation of the interactions between the living things in food chains. The children will look at the reproduction process in flowers and plants and will have the opportunity to dissect flowers in order to make careful observations. In all science work the children will gather, record, classify and present data in a variety of ways to help them answer questions.

**Mathemateg a Rhifedd /  
Mathematics and Numeracy**


This term the children will focus on timelines relating this to key events in British history then more specifically Tudor history with a focus on Henry VIII and his six wives. The children will consider the passing of time, telling the time on analogue and digital clocks, before moving on to learning about the properties of shape. The children will use a range methods with passing time and ordering data about key historical events, timers, clocks and will also look at symmetry and tessellation in relation to coats of arms and nets of shape of Tudor houses.

**Y Celfyddydau Mynegiannol /  
Expressive Arts**

Using Tudors as a focus, the children will learn about the artist Hans Holbein. This will be developed through the creative process, allowing children to create their own self portrait focusing on tone and shade. The pupils will also have the opportunity to take part in a day focused on music, dance and performance to find out about the hobbies and entertainment of the Tudor period. Pupils will be able to develop their drama skills and techniques by re-enacting the Battle of Bosworth. In addition, we will continue to have our Music First Experience lessons.

**Addysg Grefyddoll /  
Religious Education**

The pupils Religion, Values and Ethics work will focus on Authority and Influence by considering the impact Henry VIII had on religion during the 16<sup>th</sup> century. We will look at the impact Tudor monarchs had on churches and the link with All Saints Church. In the second half term, children will focus on the Journey of life, here they will learn about significant life events.

**Dyniaethau /  
Humanities**

During this term, children will use their research skills to find out who the Tudors were and what their lives were like. They will learn about the monarchs of the time and the influence they had on our lives now in terms of religion, art, health and hobbies. The children will develop their enquiry skills to find out about food, clothes, crime & punishment and diseases of the time and make comparisons to their own lives.

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
