

leithoedd, Llythrennedd a Chyfathrebu /
Languages, Literacy and Communication

The pupils will focus on poetry for the first term. The children will be learning about the syllable pattern and structure of limericks and then using this knowledge to write their own—based on the work of Ada Lovelace and others. Pupils will also explore a range of different poetry styles. In the second half term, pupils will focus on instructional writing. They will use instruction sets as inspiration for writing their own and editing and improving them. This will help develop their clarity, sequencing, and understanding of how to communicate ideas effectively. The texts used for this topic will all be based on Little People Big Dreams books.

Iechyd a Lles /
Health and Well-being

Children will reflect on the character strengths of themselves and others and how our differences help us achieve different things and are to be celebrated. They will learn the importance of good relationships with others and how to build and maintain them. They will explore the idea of gender equality in relation to people who have made significant discoveries in the past. In PE, children will develop and hone athletic skills of running, jumping and throwing in the lead up to sports day. They will also learn how to play competitive striking games such as Rounders and Danish Longball.

Cymraeg /
Welsh

The children will learn vocabulary related to the topic. They will also learn how to follow & give directions and learn prepositional language. In line with Numeracy lessons, pupils will learn how to tell the time in Welsh and will learn the days of the week, months of the year and seasons. Revision of language patterns, the alphabet and development of reading skills will take place through Helpwr Heddiw sessions.

Dyniaethau /
Humanities

Children will learn about people who have made amazing discoveries or impacted the way we live our lives today: Ada Lovelace & computer programming; Marie Curie & the use of radioactivity in medicine; Betsi Cadwaladr & her nursing career; Rosalind Franklin & DNA; Alfred Russel Wallace & his idea of evolution and Benjamin Franklin & his discoveries about electricity.



Gwyddoniaeth a Thechnoleg /
Science and Technology

Children will learn through practical activities and research the functions of the human skeleton, muscles and major organs. They will investigate the importance of dental hygiene and investigate 'Are all drinks good for our teeth?' Children will look at the work of Benjamin Franklin and learn about electricity and its uses in the modern world. They will investigate 'What materials conduct electricity?' before making electrical circuits using a variety of components. They will learn the symbols for electrical components and will predict and test if certain circuits will work or not. Children will have the opportunity to explore, write and test computer code as well as learning new digital skills in creating digital art and recording and editing a film.

Y Celfyddydau Mynegiannol /
Expressive Arts

Children will focus on developing their digital artwork, taking inspiration from the bold and bright colours used by Andy Warhol. They will learn how to edit and enhance photographs as part of their creative process. Throughout the term, pupils will also continue to enjoy Music First Experiences, led by the Music Cooperative. In addition, they will begin to develop their filming skills, taking on roles such as acting, filming, and creating voice-overs using the instructional writing they have produced in Literacy, Language and Communication lessons.

Mathemateg a Rhifedd /
Mathematics and Numeracy

This term the children will develop their ability to tell the time using analogue and digital clocks. They will use the concept of time in terms of daily and weekly activities and explain which unit of time is most appropriate. Pupils will work on fractions and experience fractions in practical situations. All pupils will continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of times tables facts. Pupils will be provided with the opportunity to explore mass and capacity and will look at the properties of 2D and 3D shape.

Crefydd, Gwerthoedd a Moeseg /
Religion, Values and Ethics

In RVE pupils will focus on the journey of life. This will discuss the journey of each pupil in getting to where they are now, mentally and physically. Pupils will look at the humanist view of evolution and natural selection. Pupils will also create a time line of their future, sharing what their aspirations are for themselves. Gender equality and gender stereotypical careers will be looked at. This is to encourage pupils to understand women and men can do any job they wish to.
